Parish Council News

Summary of issues raised/arising in the month.

(This document is not intended to be read as a record of the minutes of the Parish Council (PC) meeting.)

There was an error in last month's news. The costs reported as being Major **Development in** associated with moving the Twyford station to Ruscombe were actually the Ruscombe costs for a station at Grazely. The costs for relocating Twyford are estimated at £100m and a further £30m for the Henley branch. There are some campaign protest boards available (similar in size to a For Sale sign). If anyone would like to display one of these boards on their property please contact the Clerk. The petition, earlier in the year, gained sufficient signatures to trigger a debate in Wokingham Council and the date for that debate has just been set as Thursday 20th September, 7.30pm at Wokingham Shute End Council Chambers (the Campaign had asked for a local venue without success). This is a chance to show how much support the campaign has locally. The press will be there so the more support the better. To sign up for the updates on the CPRW go to www.cprwok.co.uk **RBWM** online The RBWM online reporting system allows residents to report missed bin reporting collections, renew a bus pass, appeal a school allocation decision, and report various problems with highways and street furniture including dangerously uncut verges. In order to use this service residents need to go to https://www3.rbwm.gov.uk/ then click on the head and shoulder icon on the top right to start the registration process. Further instructions on how to use this system are available on the village website at http://www.walthamstlawrence.info/index.php/council/1181-rbwm-onlinereporting-system-easy-instructions Several residents used this system to report a problem with excessive verge growth at the junction of The Street and Broadmoor Rd. The applicant has indicated that they want to go to appeal. Garage Development There are 3 types of appeal – 1. Written representations 2. Informal hearing 3. Public Inquiry

It is likely that this will be an informal hearing. Notice of 28 days should be
given to all interested parties of the time and place. Further documents should
be made available 3 weeks beforehand.

The planning portal states that;-

"An informal hearing involves the submission of written evidence by the main parties.

However, the process will also include an informal hearing once all the written submissions have been received.

This takes the form of a round-the-table discussion that will be led by the planning inspector. It is intended to be an informal process and allows for all parties to respond to any questions that the inspector might have, and to let everyone make their case known.

Third parties, such as local residents, councillors and amenity groups may also attend and take part in the discussion.

The majority of hearings will take no longer than a day and usually conclude with a site visit."

- Burial GroundThe burial ground has been tidied up although there is still some work to beand Memorialdone on a thorn bush and an area towards Halls Lane. The signpost by the roadGardenis rotten and will be reported to RBWM.

The PC is still considering options for rose replacement in the Memorial Garden. A request has been made that any new roses are perfumed, repeat flowering and disease resistant. An anonymous donor has offered funding, thank you.

The trees around the pond have been tidied up
It is planned to have some seating installed near the pond.

Borough LocalThe PC intends to make representations in person to the Planning Inspector at
the second set of public sessions planned for late September/early October
