There were 118 opinions registered over those three consultation meetings and a further 3 votes held up in the email system. The final analysis was 103 in favour and 16 against. It is proposed that the Parish Council enter into negotiations with RBWM to adopt the Shurlock Road Nature Reserve & Play Area. The Parish Council voted unanimously in favour of the proposal. Maggi Bevan and Suzy Young thanked all those who had contributed in any way to preparing and publicising the posters and presentation and to those who helped to man the opinion gathering events. The Chairman thanked Suzy Young & Maggi Bevan for all their help in getting to this point. It is to be noted that the main concerns raised by local residents were:	

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	 2. No pedestrian foot path from Shurlock Row past the site along the Shurlock Road to the War memorial Proposed development at Ruscombe – The Parish Council's main concerns are: i) Green Belt, ii) Infrastructure not being able to cope with the creation of so many houses, iii) The road B3024 not being able to cope with the additional traffic. It is very early days and a huge process needs to be gone through before a final decision is reached. A letter has been sent to Theresa May to assist with this as she is the local MP. It was noted that a more recent map indicates a revision of the proposed housing development which is not so close to our Parish boundary. Neighbourhood Plan: Every eligible resident in the Parish has been sent a polling card so they can vote either yes or no to the plan. 
